



Observations:

- 1) The house has been vacated almost approximately 4 years
- 2) Exposed wood requiring protection
- 3) The house is not secured
- 4) There is a copious amount of debris in the yard
- 5) The accessory structure on site has broken windows and is unsecured
- 6) The foundation wall on the North is non-existent; through the pictures you will see tarps covering the opening. The soil in between the houses did not seem safe enough to walk on. The South elevation is pushed in a considerable amount where the foundation meets the ground. The foundation has a copious amount of mortar joints missing as well. Each corner of the house has damaged block in the foundation. In short, we observed the house is shifting inward with the walls failing. The walls are revealing further deterioration and leaning to the north seem that collapse is imminent.
- 7) It is undeterminable at the time of the inspection that the utilities are in place or not.
- 8) The cellar it appears to have the north side of the house having copious amounts of soil falling in.
- 9) All the downspouts are directed to the foundation walls
- 10) The chimney is deteriorated with bricks out of place and missing mortar in between.

11) There are signs of vermin present
