On the question, Councilman Hart questioned if an individual can be charged for use of a GPS tracking device in a vehicle independent from the victim.

Chief Denz responded that the totality of the circumstances would dictate whether or not charges could be filed. He noted that legislation is quite often slower than technology and current laws do not include specific language regarding GPS tracking.

Supervisor Meegan commented that changes in this law will permit law enforcement to respond and allow cell phone users to be notified when GPS tracking has been activated on their phone.

SUPPORT FOR LEGISLATION AMENDMENT TO RPTL SECTION 102 (i)

WHEREAS, Fiber optic cable located on private property has been part of the Outside Plant roll section 6 assessment under Section 102(i) of Real Property Tax since the 1980's. Which is consistent with the valuation offiber optic cable located within the public right of way defined as Special Franchise property and,

WHEREAS, Amendments to Section 102 (i) of Real Property Tax in 1985 and 1987 were never intended to exclude fiber optic cable or other emerging technology from Outside Plant roll section 6 and,

WHEREAS, Until a recent decision by the Appellate Division, First Department removing fiber optic cable from Outside Plant roll section 6, fiber optic cable had been part of the Outside Plant assessment for over 25 years, and

WHEREAS, Across New York State hundreds of millions of dollars in tax base are in jeopardy of being lost creating a significant impact on Town, County and School taxes,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the Association of Erie County Governments including the Town of West Seneca hereby supports the Erie County Assessor's Association and respectfully request the New York State Legislature to amend Section 102 (i) of Real Property Tax Law to defining, include and memorialize fiber optic cable as part of Outside Plant for tax assessment purposes consistent with the intent of a 1986 amendment to Section 102. And which is consistent with the valuation of fiber optic cable as Special Franchise property.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Association of Erie County Governments including the Town of West Seneca supports the Erie County Assessor's Association regarding the proposed amendment to RPTL section 102(i).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to Honorable Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, Honorable Senate Majority Leader Dean Skelos, Majority Leader of Independent Democratic Caucus Jeff Klein, Honorable Senate Minority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins, Honorable Speaker of the Assembly Sheldon Silver, Honorable Leader of the Assembly Joseph Morelle, Honorable Minority Leader of the Assembly Brian Kolb, and the Western New York Delegation and Erie County Executive Mark Poloncarz and the Erie County Legislature.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF "JACKIE'S LAW"

Whereas, in the months prior to the tragic murder of Jackie Wisniewski, Jackie discovered a GPS tracking device that Timothy Jorden had installed on her car to stalk her and follow her movements and location. This specific action could not be deemed criminal due to a gap in state law. Just months later, in June 2012, Jorden shot and killed Wisniewski in a stairwell at ECMC.

Whereas, NYS Senator Timothy M. Kennedy, 63rd District, Western New York has proposed legislation to close this gap in the law. It's called Jackie's Law, and it will empower law enforcement to pursue charges and prosecute individuals who install GPS tracking systems with the intent of stalking another person.

Whereas, currently there is no legal statute that specifically outlaws the use of GPS devices in stalking cases. Jackie's Law adds a new section to the state's penal code, under "Unlawful Surveillance in the Second Degree," which makes the use of a GPS device to track a person's movement, without their consent, a class E felony. Those convicted of a class E Felony can face up to 4 years in prison.

Whereas, this legislation allows law enforcement to prosecute perpetrators for the crime of unlawful surveillance, without requiring the victim to file an Order of Protection or press charges. Law enforcement will have the ability to charge and prosecute an individual with a felony offense if he or she installs a GPS device to track the movement or location of their victim.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Town of West Seneca fully supports Senator Kennedy's proposed legislation, **Jackie's Law.**

And Be It Further Resolved, that a copy of this resolution be sent to New York State Senator Patrick M. Gallivan.
