ISSUES OF THE PUBLIC

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

Amy Carpenter suggested posting a reminder on the electronic sign with the due date for comments on the Comprehensive Plan update. Supervisor Meegan asked Mrs. Carpenter to email her suggestion to Emily Josefiak.

ROSEWOOD DRIVE PROJECT

Amy Carpenter referred to a previous discussion on sidewalk replacement on Rosewood Drive and questioned if the town could replace sidewalks and create an overlay tax district for those residents. Councilman Hart responded residents could submit a petition for creation of a sidewalk district and there would then have to be a vote of all the residents in that particular district.

ETHICS COMMITTEE

Amy Carpenter stated the Ethics Committee is lacking a few members and they still need to put together a process. Supervisor Meegan responded the Town Board will work on this issue in the future.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN COMMENTS

Nora Mikes stated she believes the 2016 Comprehensive Plan process was in violation of the NYS Open Meetings Law and asked the Town Board to table its adoption as she is currently awaiting an advisory opinion from the New York Department of State. Ms. Mikes commented she would like the town to seek massive and real public input.

Doug Kroll referred to current updates in the Comprehensive Plan and stated he is opposed to narrowing Union Road, on-street parking and roundabouts replacing traffic signals. Mr. Kroll commented that Union Road is a main highway and should remain as is, noting businesses have ample off-street parking and roundabouts will result in increased accidents. He further suggested the Comprehensive Plan be voted on by the public and not just a few people.

Councilman Hart responded that initially West Seneca residents were opposed to the five lane highway and it damaged and split the community. He suggested Mr. Kroll submit his comments in writing.

Town Attorney John Fenz advised that under New York State Law municipalities are not permitted to submit advisory or opinion questions for public referendum.

Karen Lucachik commented there is a small group of people that regularly attend Town Board meetings and most did not hear about the Comprehensive Plan meetings that were held.

SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT
Between
NYSDOT and TOWN OF WEST SENECA

THIS AGREEMENT, dated _____, 201_, is between the People of the State of New York, hereinafter referred to as "State" or "NYSDOT" and the Town of West Seneca, hereinafter referred to as "Municipality." Pursuant to Section 99-r of the General Municipal Law, the State and the Municipality wish to share services, exchange or lend materials or equipment which shall promote and assist the maintenance of State and Municipal roads and highways and provide a cost savings by maximizing the effective utilization of both parties' resources. Shared Services shall mean any service provided by one party (Provider) to another party (Recipient). The State and the Municipality agree to share services as follows:

1. Description and Cost of Services, Materials or Equipment to be shared: Provide details of the services, materials or equipment to be shared in the attached standard Schedule A. The total amount of the agreement shall not exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00). If applicable, indicate that the return exchange will be determined at a later date.
2. The Provider's employees shall remain under full supervision and control of the Provider. The parties shall remain fully responsible for their own employees for all matters, including but not limited to, salary, insurance, benefits and Workers Compensation.
3. If the borrowed machinery or equipment is damaged or otherwise needs repair arising out of or in connection with the Recipient's use, the Recipient shall be responsible for such repairs.
4. The Municipality agrees to defend and indemnify the State for any and all claims arising out of the Municipality's acts or omissions under this Agreement.
5. The term of this Agreement shall be for one (1) year. The parties will endeavor to provide no less than thirty (30) days' notice of its intent to extend the Agreement. Either party may revoke this Agreement by providing sixty (60) days written notice of such revocation. Upon revocation, any outstanding obligations of the parties must be satisfied within thirty (30) days of the date of such revocation.
