III. Old Business

A. Playgrounds

Welcome Parkitechs

- o Veteran's Park-Community Build June 3rd
 - Brian provided update and timeline with June 3rd as target for Community Build weekend and "opening" for Community Days weekend
 - ✓ Final grading done; Parkitechs to mark holes May 18th; Equipment sent on 19th; expected to received w/o May 22nd
 - ✓ Week of May 29th: 80-90% of the playground will be done by Brian and crew;
 - ✓ June 3rd: Volunteers (seeking ~ 50) will help finish it up; Parkitechs project that Build will end around 2 pm and then cleanup time
 - ✓ Parkitechs will need best guess on how many volunteers to plan accordingly
 - Suggested that once get volunteers, follow-up to confirm participation and what tools they may plan to bring
 - Brian will provide most of the tools and the larger equipment
 - ✓ Parkitechs will provide Community Build banner
 - ✓ Hot dogs, chips and drinks will be provided; location (playground or Kiwanis Club) TBD
 - ✓ Once playground is built, will need roughly two weeks for the rubber to be laid (expect it June 5th-7th) and set (about 5 days) before use

- Parkitechs discussed what to expect
 - ✓ Registration table for arrival
 - Sign-in (checkoff those who'd signed up)
 - Identify who and what tools people may bring
 - Name tag
 - Waivers for people to sign? Brian will check with the Town.
 - ✓ A safety briefing before Build starts
 - ✓ Teams broken up for specific jobs
