 - ✓ General Fund has \$12,811,000 serial bond principal outstanding for the ice rink, police headquarters, community center/library, garbage totes, and general equipment; principal payments will be decreasing \$536,553 over the next five years and completely paid off in 2042
 - ✓ Highway Fund has \$14,705,000 serial bond principal outstanding for road reconstruction projects; principal payments will be decreasing \$562,988 over the next five years and completely paid off by 2031

- ✓ Special Districts have a combined total of \$18,684,000 serial bond principal outstanding for mandated infrastructure construction, maintenance and repairs as a result of a New York State Department of Environmental Conservation consent order; principal payments will be decreasing by \$165,638 over the next five years and completely paid off by 2045
- ✓ Supervisor Meegan commented on the multiple infrastructure projects and equipment upgrades that were neglected for many years and were addressed by the current Town Board, noting the town is in a better position going forward because of these efforts.
- ✓ Councilman Hart encouraged the incoming Town Board to agressively seek state and federal funding to offset costs of infrastructure improvements
