 - ✓ Allow public to speak on any topic early in the meeting
 - √ Video recording of all boards is encouraged
 - ✓ Executive sessions should be limited in frequency and the items be more specific
 - ✓ Annual financial disclosure forms are required for municipalities with populations of fifty thousand people or more; West Seneca doesn't meet the threshold but the board can decide to do it through an Ethics Code update, then post reports online
 - ✓ Provide a link on the home page for FOIL requests; the request form shouldn't ask for a reason
 - ✓ FOIL request links for the Police Department and Courts should be available.
 - ✓ A method of tracking FOILS should be utilized
 - ✓ "Notify Me" link for meeting notifications should be prominent

7. Town Attorney re Resolution for Waste Carts, Recycling Carts, and Parts (Rehrig Pacific Co.)

Motion by Supervisor Dickson, seconded by Councilman Hanley, to adopt the following resolution for the procurement of waste and recycling totes as requested by the Highway Superintendent and authorize Highway Superintendent Brian Adams to enter into a contract with Rehrig Pacific Company with the terms and conditions of the solicitation and the bid proposal, with the pricing in accordance with the invoice proposal:

WHEREAS, the Town of West Seneca has a shortage of inventory of waste carts and recycling carts to service residents waste and recycling pick up services; and

WHEREAS, the Town endeavors to pursue methods that reduce costs while providing adequate and reliable services to our residents; and

WHEREAS, the Town of West Seneca Highway Superintendent has reviewed a bid request made by Miami-Dade County, Florida for competitive solicitations on behalf of itself and all states, local governments, school districts, and higher education institutions in the United States of America, and other governmental agencies and nonprofit organization for waste carts, recycling carts, cart parts, bins, and related products and services; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County opened the bidding process on or about January 24, 2016 and received sealed bid proposals in response to their bid request under RFP 00254; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade accepted the written bid proposal of Rehrig Pacific Company, dated March 4, 2016, and contracted with Rehrig Pacifica Company on October 5, 2016 to procure waste carts, recycling ca1is, and cart parts; and

WHEREAS, the Town of West Seneca Highway Superintendent has reviewed said RFP conducted by Miami-Dade, obtained a proposal from Rehrig Pacific Company for the procurement of 225 65 gallon waste carts, 150 95 gallon waste carts, and 225 65 gallon recycling carts, and the Highway Superintendent wishes to procure said carts from Rehrig Pacific Company based on the findings from the due diligence of the RFP by Miami-Dade where Rehrig Pacific Company was the awarded vendor; and

WHEREAS, any contract agreement to be prepared as a result of the aforementioned award will be one which incorporates by reference all the requirements, terms and conditions of the solicitation and the submitted bid proposal, with the pricing in accordance with the invoice proposal; aild

RESOLVED, that the Town of West Seneca does hereby authorize and direct the Highway Superintendent of the Town to enter into a contract with Rehrig Pacific Company with the terms and conditions of the solicitation and the submitted bid proposal, with the pricing in accordance with the invoice proposal.

On the question, the totes are for the four developments that lost condominium status last year. Each residence will receive two 65 gallon totes; as well, an extra 150 totes are being purchased for stock. They were not budgeted for last year and the budget transfer will allow for this purchase

Supervisor Dickson re Rules of Order for meetings of the Town Board

Motion by Councilman Piekarec to amend No. 12 to state "To maintain proper decorum at Town Board meetings no member of the public shall engage in any behavior that can be construed as violent, threatening, or overly obscene. Engaging in this type of behavior will result in removal from the meeting. In addition any type of peaceful demonstration that disrupts the ability of the meeting to proceed for more than 30 seconds will result in removal from the meeting".

On the question, Councilman Hanley stated he is not in favor of 30 seconds and questioned who would be removing the resident and for how long. Councilman Hanley stated he is a firm believer in the public's right to voice their opinion; people express their displeasure in different ways.

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2-E TABLED ITEMS (continued)

Councilman Piekarec replied while he attended meetings in the past, he was one to "boo" the previous Town Board; although people have a right to express themselves, a time frame would allow the meeting to continue.

Supervisor Dickson noted the language states removal is for any demonstration that disrupts the ability of the meeting to proceed. People who aren't happy may get up and express their frustration. This is trying to address people who are so disruptive the meeting cannot proceed.

Chief Denz stated removal of the public from a public event by the staff of law enforcement becomes a bit dicey as far as litigation against First Amendment rights.

Town Attorney Tina Hawthorne stated she would like the opportunity to review the amendment; there does not need to be a time frame.

Councilman Cantafio questioned if changing the words "will" to "may" and removing the time make the amendment more acceptable. Ms. Hawthorne replied the change would make huge difference. Chief Denz agreed with the change.

Councilman Cantafio suggested changing the statement to state: "To maintain proper decorum at Town Board meetings no member of the public shall engage in any behavior that can be construed as violent, threatening, or overly obscene. Engaging in this type of behavior may result in removal from the meeting" and remove the rest of the statement. Ms. Hawthorne and Chief Denz stated they concur with the suggested change.

Supervisor Dickson suggested leaving the item on the table to complete the recommended changes.

Motion by Councilman Piekarec to withdraw the amended motion.

Motion by Supervisor Dickson, seconded by Councilman Hanley, to table the item for further review.

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ISSUES OF THE PUBLIC

- A resident commented on the following:
 - ✓ Seneca Manor and Garden Gate sent thank you notes for the Christmas gifts received for their residents and also thanked the West Seneca Bee and The Sun for their coverage
 - ✓ Inquired about acquiring additional recycling totes Highway Sup't. Brian Adams responded extra totes are purchased in the Town Clerks Office for \$50 and delivered to the resident from the Highway Department
- A resident commented that the youth that live near the city line are in need of recreational opportunities close to them; would like to see more town support for the youth
- A resident commented/questioned the following:
 - ✓ Concerns regarding safety issues at the intersection at East & West Road and Angle Road Chief Denz replied his department will look into concerns at the intersection
 - ✓ Length of time sewer equipment and repairs have taken on East & West Road Councilman Hanley stated it's a county road and is scheduled to be repaved
 - ✓ What can be done to the State School property including crime that occurs there Supervisor Dickson will be addressing the issue with NYS. Chief Denz stated the police department does provide a presence as much as possible but the town has limited jurisdiction over this area
- A resident questioned if changes were made in the recycling contract and the items that will be collected Councilman Hanley explained the collection frequency and item specifications have changed; Supervisor Dickson is meeting with Modern and will bring information back to the public.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WEST SENECA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this ___day of _______, 2020, by and between the Town of West Seneca, New York (the <u>"Town"</u>), a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, with offices located at 1250 Union Road, West Seneca, New York, and the West Seneca Chamber of Commerce, Inc., (the <u>"Chamber"</u>) a not-for-profit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the New York, with offices located at 1300 Union Road, West Seneca, New York.

WHEREAS, the Town recognizes that it requires professional services to plan, organize, coordinate and implement a variety of economic development related operations; and

WHEREAS, the Chamber's Mission is consistent with the Town's vision to promote economic development in the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town desires to enhance continued efforts to expand its tax base for the benefit of the taxpayers by enlisting the services of a community economic development coordinator; and

WHEREAS, the Chamber possesses a variety of professional and technical skills to provide support to the Town by providing services to plan, organize, coordinate, and implement a variety of economic development related operations.

NOW THEREFORE, the Town and the Chamber, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and undertakings herein set forth, agree as follows:

1. SERVICES TO BE RENDERED; FIXED COST CONTRACT

- 1.1 <u>Services of the Chamber:</u> The Chamber agrees to perform that work and those services identified and more particularly described as follows:
 - a.) Maintain regular office hours;
 - b.) Attend scheduled manager meetings with the Erie County Industrial Development Agency (the "ECIDA"):
 - c.) Actively solicit businesses to locate within the Town's boundaries;
 - d.) Assist West Seneca businesses interested in relocation or expansion within the Town;
 - e.) Act as a liaison between the ECIDA and West Seneca businesses;
 - f.) Inform and educate West Seneca businesses about the ECIDA programs and other economic development programs;
 - g.) Participate in community development activities;
 - h.) Work in conjunction with the Town Code Enforcement Office and the Town Attorney to assist businesses with understanding the various Town approval processes.

- 1.2 <u>Fixed Cost Contract</u>: This is a fixed cost contract. The cost shall not exceed, unless approved by an amendment, **FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS** (\$15,000.00) annually.
- Ouarterly Reports: The Chamber shall provide the Town with a quarterly report of its services on or before January 1st, April 1st, July 1st, and October 1st. Further, at the request of the Town, the Chamber shall meet with its representatives to review ongoing initiatives and progress.

2. COMMENCEMENT; TERM

- 2.1 <u>Commencement Date:</u> Performance of Services shall begin on January 1, 2020.
- 2.2 <u>Term:</u> The Term of this Agreement shall be from January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020.

3. PERSONNEL

- 3.1 <u>Personnel:</u> The Chamber represents that it has, or will secure at its own expense, all professionally qualified personnel required to perform the services outlined in this Agreement.
- 3.2 <u>Chamber's Status as Independent Contractor:</u> The Chamber and its personnel shall not be employees of the Town for any purpose. The Chamber shall have sole responsibility to employ, supervise and pay such employees, professionals, subcontractors, and sub-consultants as are necessary for the efficient performance of this Agreement. Under no circumstances shall the Town be responsible for any employee, professional, principal, subcontractor, or sub-consultant of the Chamber for the payment of wages, fees, taxes, withholding, workers' compensation, unemployment insurance, or any other form of remuneration that would signify an employer/employee relationship between the Town and the Chamber or any employee, professional, principal, subcontractor or subconsultant of the Chamber.

4. TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

- 4.1 Events of Default: Any one or more of the following acts or omissions by the Chamber shall constitute an event of default hereunder (hereinafter referred to as "Events of Default"):
 - Failure to perform or complete any of the Services as scheduled or as required by this Agreement;
 - b. Failure to maintain the records required hereunder or to permit access thereto;

c. Failure in the performance of any of its remaining obligations hereunder or a default in any of the other covenants and conditions of this Agreement;

4.2 <u>Termination:</u>

- a. Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default, Town shall thereupon have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to the Chamber of such termination and specifying the effective date of termination, which shall be on at least fourteen (14) days' notice.
- b. The Town further reserves the right, upon thirty (30) days' written notice, to terminate this Agreement for reason other than upon the occurrence of any Event of Default after discussion and attempt to resolve the underlying basis for the termination of this Agreement.
- c. In such event, the Chamber shall refund, if applicable, the Town with a pro-rata share of the fixed cost paid pursuant to the terms of this Agreement as of the date of the written notice to terminate.

5. RECORDS AND AUDITS

The Chamber shall maintain accounts and records, including personnel, property and financial records, adequate to identify and account for all costs pertaining to the Agreement. These records shall be made available for inspection and audit purposes to the Town. The Chamber shall preserve all such records for three years after the expiration of this Agreement.

6. AMENDMENTS

The Town may request changes in the services to be performed hereunder by the Chamber. Such changes shall be mutually agreed upon by and between the Town and the Chamber. Any mutually agreed upon changes shall be incorporated in written amendments to this Agreement.

7. ASSIGNABILITY

The Chamber shall not assign any interest in this Agreement and shall not transfer any interest in the same (whether by assignment or notation), without the prior written consent of the Town.

8. WAIVER OF BREACH

No waiver by the Town of its right to enforce any provisions hereof after any default on the part of the Chamber shall be deemed a waiver of its right to enforce each and all of the provisions hereof upon any further or other default on the part of the consultant.

9. PAYMENT

Payment under this Agreement shall be made to the Chamber by the Town in four (4) equal installments of \$3,750.00. The first payment shall be due upon execution of the Agreement, and the remaining payments shall be made upon receipt of the second, third and fourth quarterly reports as set forth above.

10. INDEMNIFICATION

The Chamber will defend, indemnify, hold harmless, and exempt the Town and its subcommittees and elected officials, its staff and all their officers, agents, servants, and employees, from and against any and all suits, actions, legal proceedings, claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses and attorney's fees incident to any work done in the performance of this Agreement arising out of a willful or negligent act or omission of the Chamber, its officers, agents, subconsultants, servants, or employees: provided however, that the Chamber shall not be liable for any suits, actions, legal proceedings, claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses, and attorney's fees arising out of a willful or negligent act or omission of the Client, its offices, agents, servants and employees, or third parties.

11. SEVERABILITY

Should any provision in any section of this Agreement be found to be illegal or otherwise unenforceable, all other provisions and sections of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

12. ENTIRETY

This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes any and all prior proposals, negotiations and agreements, whether written or oral. Any amendment to this Agreement shall be void unless it is in writing and subscribed by the party against whom the amendment is sought to be enforced.

13. VENUE

This Agreement shall be governed by and under the laws of the State of New York. In the event that a dispute arises between the parties, the venue for the resolution of such a dispute shall be the County of Erie, State of New York.
