Policing Reform Plan

Please see attached for a resolution to approve the *Policing Reform Plan* drafted by the "West Seneca Police Reform and Reinvention Task Force". Upon adoption of the resolution, the Town Board authorizes the Supervisor's Office to execute and submit the attached *Plan Certification Form* and *Policing Reform Plan* to the New York State Division of the Budget by the established deadline of April 1, 2021.

WHEREAS: The NYS Police Reform & Reinvention Collaborative was directed by NYS Governor Andrew Cuomo's Executive Order No. 203 of June 12, 2020; and

WHEREAS: All municipalities in New York State that have police forces are required to participate and submit a written plan by April 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS: If communities fail to submit a written plan, their funding will be withheld by the NYS Department of Budget; and

WHEREAS: This process was structured according to the guidelines provided in the New York State Police Reform and Reinvention Collaborative, requiring community input and participation, along with an assessment of the Police Department's policies, practices, and procedures; and

WHEREAS: The Town of West Seneca understands that maintaining public safety is extremely important and is one of the essential roles of government. To achieve that goal, there must be mutual trust and respect between police and the communities they serve; and

WHEREAS: The Town of West Seneca has followed the guidelines of the Police Reform & Reinvention Collaborative in the following ways:

- Convened local stakeholders in the community with the formation of a "West Seneca Police Reform and Reinvention Task Force";
- Reviewed the needs of the community served by the Town of West Seneca Police
  Department and conducted a comprehensive review of the Department's current
  deployments, strategies policies, procedures and practices;
- Developed a "Policing Reform Plan" to improve such deployments, strategies, policies, procedures, and practices;
- Involved the entire community in the discussion by way of a public survey distributed in February 2021;
- Offered the Plan in draft form for public comment to all citizens and hosted a communitywide conversation on March 2, 2021 and March 4, 2021. No comments or recommendations were received from the public; and

WHEREAS: The Town of West Seneca Town Board has reviewed and considered the information presented in the Plan; therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the Town of West Seneca Town Board accepts and adopts the Town of West Seneca Policing Reform Plan and will use it as a guide for future decision-making; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Town of West Seneca Town Board, upon adoption of this resolution, hereby authorizes the Supervisor to execute and submit the Plan Certification Form and Policing Reform Plan to the New York State Division of the Budget by the established deadline of April 1, 2021.

	The legislative body of the Local Government has ratified or adopted the Plan by local law or resolution.
