Code Enforcement Officer Schieber shared his thoughts on accommodating dispensaries within the town. Mr. Schieber suggested the Town Board could add dispensaries to the Special Permit process in the Town Code that regulates businesses which have the potential to affect surrounding property owners; this process currently regulates any automotive uses, service of alcohol, and multiple dwellings and apartment buildings. Applicants attend a Planning Board meeting where details are scrutinized, and

neighboring property owners share concerns. A second public hearing occurs at a Town Board meeting where the Town Board grants or denies the request.

Mr. Schieber stated another approach is to classify dispensaries as retail sales to fall under C-1 or C-2 zoning districts. Adding dispensaries to the Special Permit process would require details such as consumption on site, appearance of the building, number of employees, and hours of operation be provided, and the neighbors can share concerns before approval is granted. In his opinion, Mr. Schieber believes this is the easiest way to fit dispensaries into the Town Code. Other alternatives include creating overlay districts to limit and regulate activities along with requiring licenses. Additionally, there is a section in the Town Code specifically for adult uses with restrictions that would severely limit the possible locations. Mr. Schieber stated no dispensaries have approached the town yet.

Supervisor Dickson stated there is a survey for residents to take and questioned Mr. Schieber if the town would be able to limit the number of dispensaries to one or two. Mr. Schieber responded that a property owner would have the right to operate a business if they have met the criteria of the zoning code.

## **ISSUES OF THE PUBLIC**

- A resident had the following comments:
  - ✓ Suggested auditing the Town Codes Supervisor Dickson stated some codes have been updated and more will be reviewed
  - ✓ Firepits continue to pose health issues Town Attorney Hawthorne stated she is currently reviewing a draft provided by the Code Enforcement office. Code Enforcement Officer Schieber stated his office becomes involved after a complaint is received by the Police Department; the responding police officers assess the situation and provide feedback to Code Enforcement. The draft provided to the Town Attorney would provide more authority to the police officers and Code Enforcement and current regulations are taken from the NYS Fire Code.
  - ✓ Warrant No. 1460 Town Attorney Hawthorne stated the 45,000 settlement was for a 2011 lawsuit, Cheryl Richardson vs. the Town of West Seneca, the prior insurance company had never billed the town for its share
  - ✓ Warrant No. 1462 Supervisor Dickson can review and provide details.
  - ✓ Requests the Town Board address short-term rentals, aka Airbnb's, and put a policy in place Councilman Hanley questioned Code Enforcement Officer Schieber if his office has received phone calls about them. Mr. Schieber stated his office was asked if short-term rentals were permissible and is not aware of any complaints. Councilman Piekarec stated it would be difficult to enforce; most Airbnb's are used as a less expensive option than a hotel.

- A resident made the following comments regarding dispensaries:
  - ✓ Observes the comments made and posts that were "liked" by some Town Board members on social media/newspapers to be negative towards dispensaries
  - ✓ Supports other peoples' right to consume marijuana
  - ✓ There is a financial benefit to the town to allow dispensaries
  - ✓ Referred to a news article stating a cannabis dispensary is looking to select West Seneca due to the location
  - ✓ Used the West Seneca Police Department's social media accounts description of the Queen of Heaven Carnival patrons as an example that sales and consumption of alcohol are widely accepted and celebrated but marijuana is viewed differently
  - ✓ Marijuana offers medicinal benefits and is not listed in an article about the drug overdose deaths in 2020
  - ✓ Zoning should be consistent with alcohol and tobacco sales
  - ✓ Alcohol-to-go during the pandemic was popular, would like consistency with cannabis
  - ✓ Cannabis usage is already in West Seneca, not allowing dispensaries will not keep it out
  - ✓ Referred to Chair of the Republican Party/Supervisor's spouse recent post on the town Facebook page stating "consumers are mainly 18 35-year old's, who have grown up with little or no social skills from video games to everyone gets a trophy..." stated the post is insulting and condescending
  - ✓ Society will not fall apart by allowing dispensaries

Councilman Piekarec stated he is not against allowing dispensaries but would like the zoning decided before allowing them.

Councilman Hanley stated the Town Board is going into the process with an open mind.

Supervisor Dickson questioned why the resident feels he is against dispensaries. The resident responded the Supervisor's comments have been neutral to negative and cited an article in the Sun where the Supervisor stated he has not heard from many people who are in favor of dispensaries. Supervisor Dickson responded that he is stating facts based on data. The resident cited Facebook posts made by the Chairperson of the Republican Party/Supervisor's wife stating she has seen the lives damaged by drugs and worked with "gang members and their baby mommas" and that \$80,000 is not much worth it, as this is half a town employee, the resident noted, Supervisor Dickson "liked" the comment. Supervisor Dickson stated the Chairperson is a past president of Cazenovia Recovery and would go into jails to teach parenting skills to people who had lost their parental rights often because of addiction; this has given her a different perspective.

Supervisor Dickson stated alcohol is legal and pointed out many campaigns and efforts against drunk driving and alcohol related issues, illustrate the fact that not everyone in society is for alcohol. Many residents have shared their opposition of dispensaries despite the financial benefit to the town and West Seneca seems to be unique in seeking the public's input.

- A resident made the following comments:
  - ✓ Wants the town to send the message to children that West Seneca is against drugs. Councilman Piekarec stated people will still travel through town as they return home from dispensaries.
  - Referred to the number of alcohol related issues that occurred after the Queen of Heaven Carnival and requested better controls on future events
  - ✓ Complimented the new splash pad and thanked the Town Board for their responsiveness
